You can either subscribe with a partner (external is allowed) or alone and find a partner to dance with at the workshop.



Theme & Dress Code

Naturally, a gala cannot be a gala without a theme and a dress code that fits this theme! As you know, the theme for this year's lustrum gala is "Midsummer Night".

Midsummer is the Swedish celebration of the summer solstice, the longest day of the year and takes place in June. But to honor this year's lustrum theme "Expect the Unexpected", we'll be celebrating it in November!

A successful midsummer party formula involves flowers in your hair, dancing around a pole, singing songs while drinking unsweetened, flavored schnapps and a fitting outfit. To fit this lovely theme there will be a black-tie dress code.

For the ladies, this means you have to wear an elegant evening gown. However, a neat cocktail dress is also allowed, but in combination with tights. The longer and darker the dress, the more formal. It should be noted that watches are not allowed. Either high and low heels are suitable for a black-tie event.

For the gentlemen, this dress code means wearing a dark tuxedo with a white shirt and a black bow tie. Make sure that your leather shoes match the color of your belt. Optionally, you can also wear a handkerchief in your breast pocket, to introduce a little creativity to your look. Lastly, do not forget the corsage for you and your date. More of this will be explained in the "Etiquette" section of this booklet.

Incorporating flowers in your outfit is highly encouraged!




Etiquette

If you thought the dress code was the only thing you should think of, you're wrong. A gala goes with etiquette. We will list them here for you. A gala is not complete without a date. The ladies get asked by the gentlemen. The gentleman will write a letter to the lady, written with silver ink on blue paper, to ask her to join him to the gala. As a response, the lady will write a letter back in golden ink on pink paper in which she invites him for a cup of tea.

During this date, the gala is not discussed, but the tea will indicate whether the lady wants to join the gentleman to the gala:


- Only a cup of tea means a no.
- Tea with cookies means she wants to go to the gala together as friends.
- Tea with a pastry means she wants to go as more than just friends, but the gentleman has to conquer her during the gala.
- Tea with a pastry with whipped cream means that the gentleman already conquered her.

If the lady decides to join the gentleman to the gala, she should inform him on the colour of her dress, so that the gentleman knows what colour the corsages should be. She should do this in a very subtle way, for instance by drooping a bit of her dress outside her closet.

As said earlier, the corsage is taken care of by the gentleman. This can be a nice flower arrangement, but you are encouraged to use your fantasy. The gentlemen wear their corsage on the left side, the ladies wear it upside down on their dress.

On the night of the gala, the lady gets picked up by the gentleman at her house. Where she is greeted with a hand kiss, whereby the gentleman's lips barely touch her hand. Only when the lady is wearing gloves, this is taboo. When the lady is escorted, she walks at the gentleman's left side. The only exception to this is in dangerous situations. Then, the gentleman will walk on the "unsafe" side.

The gentleman lets the lady go ahead at all times but one. On the stairs, the gentleman goes first to avoid inappropriate looks. Only if the stairs are very steep, the lady goes ahead so that the gentlemen can catch her if she happens to fall.

The gentleman asks a lady to dance with him by making a little bow. The lady agrees by making a little nod. Or the lady can drag the gentleman onto the dancefloor.

It should be noted that these rules are rather old fashioned and are just a formality. Of course, you can wear whatever you like, ask who ever you want to the gala, you can also go alone or go with your friends. The main goal is for you to have fun!
